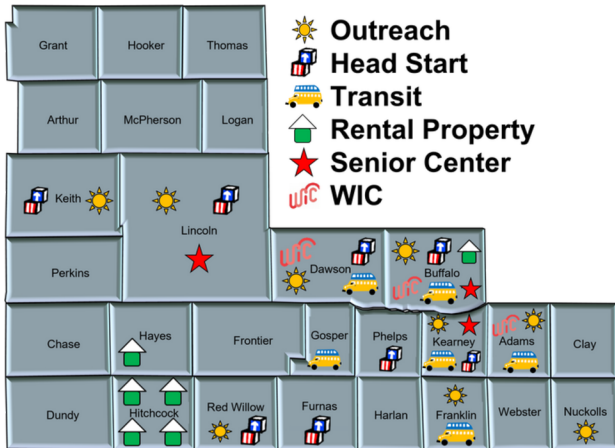


Our Mission:

Our agency serves 139 communities in 27 south-central Nebraska counties including:

Adams, Arthur, Buffalo, Chase, Clay, Dawson, Dundy, Franklin, Frontier, Furnas, Gosper, Grant, Harlan, Hayes, Hitchcock, Hooker, Kearney, Keith, Lincoln, Logan, McPherson, Nuckolls, Perkins, Phelps, Red Willow, Thomas, and Webster counties.



Board and Policy Advisory Committee Roles:

The Community Action Board of Directors approves policies and all grant applications, budgets, etc. The Board consists of representatives from the following community segments: 1/3 elected public officials, 1/3 private sector, and 1/3 consumer representatives.

Community Action also has Policy Advisory Committees (PACs) comprised of local representatives. PACs promote public involvement in our operations, policies, and philosophy.

At Community Action Partnership of Mid-Nebraska, we serve thousands of individuals and families across 27 counties and 21,000 square miles, offering programs that advance education, health, housing, nutrition, and transportation. Safe and stable housing gives families a foundation to thrive. Our Programs

Community Services:

Our **Community Service Coordinators** are the link for individuals and families to vital resources. They take program applications, make referrals, and work one-on-one with with families and individuals towards self-sufficiency. For those who qualify, CSCs may assist with emergency rent, utilities and other services if funds are available. Lexington, Minden, Superior, and Franklin also provide food pantries for qualifying households.

Weatherization:

The **Weatherization Assistance Program** helps low-income households, with an emphasis on those whose occupants are elderly, have a disability, have young children, or homes that have a high residential energy usage or high energy burden, to permanently reduce their utility bills.

Weatherization is available to those who rent or own a frame or mobile home.

Typical measures may include adding insulation (attic, sidewall, crawl space, and under mobile homes) weatherstripping, and caulking. Broken windows and doors may be replaced and furnace and water heater may be repaired or replaced if the units are unsafe.

RYDE Transit:

Reach Your Destination Easily Transit, also known as **RYDE**, provides accessible, low cost public transportation. Buses are operated in Adams, Buffalo, Dawson, Franklin, Gosper, Hamilton, and Kearney counties. Each location has buses equipped with wheelchair lifts. RYDE services are available to the general public.

Head Start:

Our **Head Start and Early Head Start Programs** support the development of children from birth to age 5 through individual comprehensive services and family and community engagement. In addition to educational services, Head Start programs also help support social and emotional health, nutrition, family goal-setting, and more.

Women, Infants, and Children (WIC):

WIC is a supplemental nutrition program which provides health referrals, breastfeeding support, and nutritious foods to income-eligible pregnant, breastfeeding, or post-partum women, infants, and children up to age five.

The **Breastfeeding Peer Counseling Program** provides 24/7 breastfeeding support & education to WIC eligible pregnant & breastfeeding women from a peer counselor who has also breastfed and is/was also on the WIC program. Each peer counselor is trained with the USDA Food and Nutrition Services Breastfeeding Curriculum.

Immunizations:

Immunizations may be provided to uninsured adults and children who are underinsured, uninsured, or Medicaid eligible. We ask for a suggested donation of \$19.00/vaccine, however no one is turned away for inability to pay.

Mobile Produce Pantries

Our agency provides assistance with food security through **Mobile Produce Pantries** in Buffalo, Phelps and Kearney Counties. Dates, times, and locations can be found on our website.

Senior Volunteer Program:

Through the **Senior Volunteer Program**, volunteers (60 years and older) reach out to other seniors in Buffalo County to help them remain independent in their home.

CSFP:

CSFP (Commodities Supplemental Food Program) provides supplemental nutritious and shelf-stable foods to income eligible adults 60 years and older on an every other month basis.

Senior Centers:

Senior meals are served in **Minden** (on-site and to-go), **North Platte** (on-site and delivery), and at the **Kearney Peterson Senior Activity Center** (on-site and to-go). Senior centers provide recreational activities, social activities, and more.
